Welcome to this year's event

Once again we are pleased to welcome teams from around England and abroad, their coaches and spectators, our generous event sponsors “[Wot's Up Ipswich](#)”, and our fabulous matchday officials, to the 2024 CP Challenge Trophy. With a switch to the wonderful facilities at the University of Warwick, we anticipate another highly enjoyable days football with the same ethos of friendship, development and competition at the forefront!

As in 2023, forty two matches will be played across the day - it will be a busy, fast paced event which we hope everyone will be looking forward to as much as we the organising team are!

There will be two group stages with six teams in each group. After the group games are completed, the top two teams from each group go into Tier one, the next two from each group go into Tier two, and the next two from each group into Tier three.

From there, semi finals are played in each tier, followed by third and fourth place play-offs and of course ending with finals. So each team plays an equal amount of games across the day, giving everyone as much playing time as possible. We believe this structure also gives every team and player something to play for throughout the day whatever their level.

We hope you will leave Warwick with some fabulous memories and who knows, maybe new friends too!

The CP Challenge Trophy background

The Challenge Trophy came about as a result of fixtures played between South West CP, Surrey CP FC and CP United, where friendships had been developed over a period of time and players were able to feel confident that each game they played in would be played competitively but fairly, and with the friendly ethos being the underlying factor in all that we were doing.

The success of these fixtures led us to look at reaching out to other clubs and extending the work that had been done, and with further friendship styled matches being enjoyed with those other clubs, it was agreed that the format worked and the next step would be a one day invitational competition that could involve many of the clubs we had engaged with, all at one event, and so the idea of the Challenge Trophy was born. The inaugural event in 2022 was a great success and has meant expanding to allow more teams to become involved.

We are very proud of the friendship ethos that has grown from our original fixtures where trust, fairness and a desire to see players from other clubs as well as our own, flourish, develop and enjoy their meetings and games with each other is paramount.

We hope and indeed ask that every coach, player and spectator present at the 2024 CP Challenge Trophy will work with us in continuing to employ this ethos and style of fixture.

CP Challenge Trophy look back

Whilst we prepare to enjoy the 3rd CP Challenge Trophy in 2024 we thought we would take a brief look back at our last two events which were played on 12 March 2022 and 11 March 2023 at St George's Park.

At our inaugural event in 2022 the day begun with a minutes enthusiastic applause to show support for the people of Ukraine (one of the top CP teams in the world) Donations to the Disaster Emergency Committee Ukraine Humanitarian Appeal via collection buckets raised £300 on the day for this cause.

The day itself saw 10 teams from across England play 29 games - and a fair few penalty shootouts! - with 3 tier winners trophies awarded, Tier 1 went to South West CP Sky, Tier 2 to Surrey CP and Tier 3 to West CP Blue.

At our 2nd event in 2023 we benefitted from the use of the Sir Alf Ramsay indoor pitch at St Georges Park. Again we employed a 3 tier system for the competition, and tailored it to reflect our extended 12 team event, with friends now even coming across from overseas - CP Soccer from the USA, CP Development from Ireland, and initially V.V. de Merinos from the Netherlands too, although sadly their flight was cancelled on the tarmac due to snow so they didn't make it on the day.

CP Soccer came out as Tier 1 winners, Surrey CP Tier 2 winners and CP Utd Development Tier 3 winners.

The ethos of Friendship- Development- Competition was introduced right from the start of the CPCT in 2022 and these have been on show in abundance, and we continue to run the CP Challenge Trophy tournaments in the same way.

The organisers have been thrilled with the response and feedback received and to hear that everyone enjoyed both previous events. Some amazing football and attitudes have been displayed by all the teams and our referees & volunteers helped the tournaments run smoothly and are very much appreciated!

We now look forward to the 2024 CP Challenge Trophy, and another cracking day of competition!

LOCATION

The tournament will be played at Warwick University's Cryfield facility, Cryfield Village, CV4 7EU, with arrival possible from 8.30 a.m. and finishing after presentations at around 5pm.

HOWEVER ...please note that the postcode is a "blanket" one which covers a large area. We would recommend using [Leighfield Road](#) for sat nav destination.

VEHICLE PARKING

Limited parking outside the Cryfield pavilion is available for wheelchair users on a strictly first come first served basis, and will be barrier controlled.

Minibuses and coaches;

Photography

Only the official event photographer will be allowed onto the playing areas, but spectators are welcome to take photographs/videos from the spectator gallery and other outside areas.

Gazebos

Being an outdoor event and the English weather being what it is, team gazebos are welcome to be erected on the grass area adjacent to the pitch entrance, but please let us know if you will be bringing one along. You will be responsible for putting them up and breaking them down at either end of the day, and at all other times. The organisers will not be held liable for any incidents arising from the use of gazebos on the day.

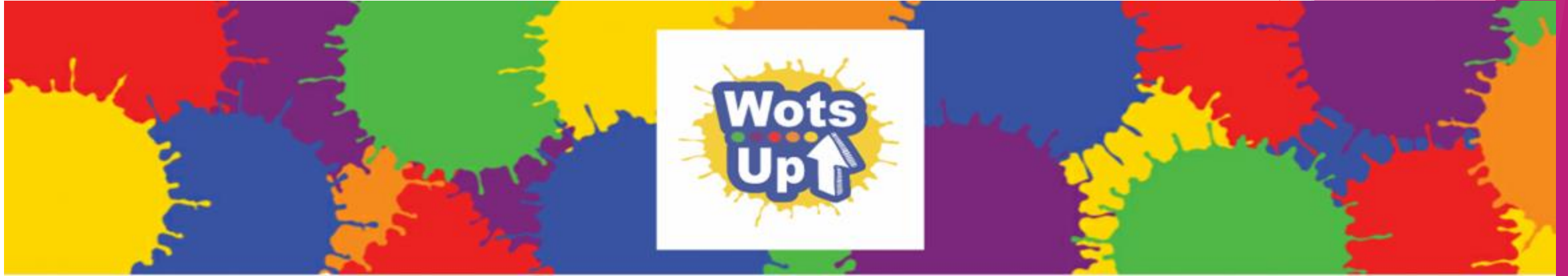

“Surrey CP FC is a small and relatively young club formed in late 2020, once Covid restrictions allowed outside exercise in groups, initially to provide an outlet for adults with cerebral palsy to play football and exercise together in a safe and egalitarian environment amongst others with similar disabilities, with minimal costs being paramount. Volunteer coaches with years of disability experience deliver regular training sessions and travel to disability fixtures around the country with the players and look after their welfare during these.

We are one of the few CP specialist clubs in the country, but following the easing of covid restrictions we have been able to welcome additional players with conditions such as autism, visual and hearing impairments.

The club engages with other similar clubs around the country with a friendship ethos being the highest priority, giving richer social opportunities to players both within Surrey CP FC and those at other clubs.”

“ SWCP United was originally the SWCP Regional Talent Centre which were funded by the FA. These formed in approximately 2008/09. CP Challenge Cup 2024 Rules

Please read and share the tournament rules with all your players and coaches.

Competition Format:

The competition is called the **CP Challenge Trophy** and will be sanctioned by the FA.

The competition is by invitation only. Places are allocated upon receipt of a fully completed entry form and cleared payment. Successful entries will be confirmed by the competition organisers at least 14 days prior to the tournament.

Age Groups, Squads and Player Qualification.

The tournament is an open age event. (Players must be aged 16+ on the day of the tournament)

Each club shall register a team of players prior to the day of the event, which can be up to a maximum of 14 players. Players shall play only for the team in which they are named, unless as per the competition 'friendship ethos', they are being loaned to another team by agreement.

Each team shall appoint a manager / coach who has responsibility for their teams registration, being ready to play and communicating the tournament rules to their players and supporters.

All players must wear shin pads and appropriate footwear – *no blades or metal studs.*

Playing Rules

The rules of association football will apply. **All normal football rules apply except:**

- The format is 7 a side
- There is no off-side
- Throw-ins can be normal behind the head throws, or can be rolled in but in this case the ball must touch the ground **within 1 metre upon leaving the hand.**
- You must have a **minimum** of one FT1 (most impaired) player on the pitch at all times.
- You can have a **maximum** of one FT3/FT4 (least impaired) player on the pitch at any time.
- International classifications (IFCPF rules) override club or national league given classifications and will be used for this tournament. If a player is not eligible to play for their country due to declassification, they **must** be classified as FT4 for this tournament.
- The remainder of a teams 7 players can be a combination of FT1 & FT2.

As stated in the general information we are all at different stages of our club's development – in relation to classification please engage with us to discuss your team's situation and we can support with our knowledge and experience to ensure a fair, fun and competitive days football.

Matches (Pitch 1 will be closest to the changing rooms and Pitch 2 furthest from the changing rooms)

- ▶ Please ensure you are ready to play your games and at your pitch in good time as there is a tight turn-around in fixtures.
- ▶ All games will be 15 minutes straight through (with the exception of each Tier final being 20 minutes time constraints permitting).

****Please note that goal difference WILL NOT be a factor at any stage of the tournament****

Playing Rules - continued

League (group stages)

Win = 3 points, Draw = 1 point, Loss = 0 points

The final standing of teams in each league will be determined by points scored.

If teams finish level on points, head-to-head results will be used to determine places.

If head-to-head results do not separate tied teams, then penalties will be used to decide the outcome.

These will be sudden death – the penalty takers must take one penalty each in turn from the ON PITCH squad that finished the game until one team misses or the whole squad has been used, at which point the process will repeat..

▶ Results as outlined above will determine progression to each Tier and the knock out stages

Knock-Out Stages

If teams are level at full-time then penalties will decide the outcome. Penalty takers must be from the ON PITCH squad that finished the game. 3 penalties from each team will be taken, if teams are still level then sudden death penalties will determine the outcome.

Medals and Trophies

The winning team from each Tier final will receive a Trophy. (Tier 1 Winners will also win the overall tournament shield which is returned for the following years tournament)

Players from the winning and runner up teams in each Tier will receive medals.

Playing Rules - continued

Matches

1st named team on the fixture sheet has kick-off

2nd named team on the fixture list to change colours (**please bring your own bibs**) at the match officials instruction if there is a colour clash

Referee to hand match card to Match Day Co-ordinator / CP Challenge Trophy official for results to be logged.

Referees

Referees shall be appointed by the CP Challenge Trophy organisers.

Players, Officials and Supporters Conduct:

In the unlikely event cards are required, the competition uses the red and yellow card system.

All cautions and red cards to be dealt with on the day Any misconduct from the tournament will be reported to the FA / County FA by the referee as normal.

Playing Rules - continued

Red and Yellow Cards: (additional information)

- ▶ A player who is dismissed from the field of play for any reason **apart from** violent conduct, serious foul play, threatening, abusive, indecent or insulting words or behaviour shall be suspended automatically for one match in the Tournament, immediately following the match in which he was sent off. This includes two yellow cards received within the same match or a straight red card.
- ▶ A player who is dismissed from the field of play for violent conduct, serious foul play, threatening, abusive, indecent or insulting words or behaviour whether he has previously been cautioned in the match or not, shall be suspended for the remainder of the Tournament, immediately following the match in which he was sent off. For spitting at another person, they will be suspended from the tournament and reported to The Football Association.
- ▶ All extraordinary incidents should be reported to The Football Association. In exceptional circumstances the Football Association may deem it necessary to impose a greater sanction.

Protests and Appeals

All questions of eligibility, qualification of players or interpretation of Rules shall be referred to the Tournament Committee, but no objection relative to the dimensions of the playing area or other appurtenances thereon shall be entertained by the Committee unless a protest is lodged with the referee before the commencement of the game.

Safeguarding / Respect

Please come and see us or call Jane (07980881420 or Julie 07775802317) with any concerns.

Please ensure there are no parents or spectators entering the changing room area. If players need help with socks, shoes, shin pads, laces etc then it is up to team officials/coaches to help. There will be guidance on the day on the location of toilets for those watching the games. There is a water fountain in Cryfield Pavilion so please bring water bottles which can be refilled.

Coaches are to use the middle technical area set out between the pitches to coach from and vacate this area when your team is not playing.

Coaches must ensure the photo consent form for your squad(s) is signed when registering your arrival which will be pitch side and also amend the squad names if needed.

As stated in our Ethos and aims, Respect is a big part of how we want to do things and it is the responsibility of **EVERYONE** who attends on the day to promote this, so please be respectful of the site and of each other at all times - We want this to be a fun and enjoyable day of football for everyone involved.

In the spirit of the game/Friendship ethos

If a team is short of players, please help each other out by supporting with borrowing/lending of players from/to another team – this can be done on an ad hoc basis as needed – however in the spirit of this tournament please make your opposition aware if you are borrowing a player / players from another team, and adhere to the classification requirements. We advise this method as opposed to removing players to even out teams, as it allows more players more time on the pitch.

In all other instances, all teams should remain as set on the submitted team sheets.

Please be respectful of the referees, they may have travelled long distances to help us and without them we cannot play.

We fully appreciate there is a lot to read through, but please familiarise yourself and your players with the information. If you wish to clarify anything please contact the event organisers.
